## Attendance, Absence and Late/Tardy Policy

**The school reserves the right to determine whether an absence is excused, unexcused or truant based Education Code section 48205.**

Please keep your ill child at home. Good health is more important than perfect attendance. Please keep your child at home if the illness is contagious. If antibiotics have been prescribed, do not let your child return to school until 24 hours after the first dose has been administered. Courtesy to other students and the staff requires that all communicable diseases be reported to the school office immediately.

Please do not send your child to school saying to them, "If you do not feel good, call home." Invariably, the child will come to the office to call home. If they do not feel well, keep them at home.

Arriving late can be a serious problem at school. When a child is late, the teacher must stop instruction, change his/her attendance and lunch count, and review instruction at the time of the child's arrival. Students must stop by the office when they are late to get a class admittance slip for excused or unexcused tardies. If a child is late due to a doctor or dental appointment, verification from the doctor or dentist must be submitted in order to receive an excused tardy.

A child is late if they arrive at school by 8:30 in the morning. If a child arrives after 8:30 they are considered tardy. More than 3 unexcused tardies in any school year can result in a letter and possible referral to the School Attendance Review Board for further action.

**Children are late at Walnut School if they are not lined up with their class on the blacktop when the 8:00 a.m. bell rings.**

Consequences for being late are as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> late: No Consequence

2<sup>nd</sup>- 10<sup>th</sup> late: Lunch Detention

11- After school detention for 30 minutes for each occurrence and parent contact

You have received a calendar for the 2009-2010 school years. Please plan any of your vacations around our school holidays. That way, your children will know that you value their education and progress in school.

The State requires us to mark a student truant if he or she is absent from school due to family vacations. With this in mind, please plan your vacations and family celebrations when school is not in session.

## Homework for the Absent Child

If you expect your child to be out for just a day or two, we prefer that you do not request homework. Instead, "make-up" work will be assigned upon the student's return.

If the child has a prolonged illness, parents should call before 9:30 AM to make arrangements for work to be sent home. This work will usually be practice or drill work related to classroom instruction, or continuation of a long term project or report. We ask parents to stay in contact with the teacher(s) by telephone in order to work out a mutually convenient arrangement for the homework completion.

**If you call after 9:30 AM the homework will be ready for you the next day.**

## Visitors

All visitors, **including parents**, are to report directly to the office, sign in, and obtain a visitor pass. Please do not drop anything off in your child's class.

## Updating School Records

It is very important that the office keep current telephone numbers of the parents' place of employment and the name, or names, of a friend or relative who can be called in the event of an emergency when parents can't be reached. It is crucial that at least one other name be listed under emergency contacts on the emergency cards. Please remember that you can not call the school to release your child to someone whose name is not on the emergency card. Any changes to the emergency card must be made by a parent in person at the school. A note to the teacher is not sufficient.

## If your child walks to school....

For safety reasons, please remind your child to walk in a group. Children should not arrive at school before 7:30 as there is no supervision for them. Children are to be reminded to obey the crossing guard(s) at all times and not to cross until he/she signals that it is safe to do so.

## Parking Lot Safety

For the benefit and safety of all our students, please enter only at the northern entrance of Walnut School and exit only at the southern exit of the parking lot. In the morning, please drive as far down the driveway towards the dumpsters as possible before dropping off your child(ren).

Remember to drive slowly and defensively in our parking lot.

When picking up children please remember that our bus riders are picked up first at 2:25. Only after the busses have left the parking lot may parents drive down to the south end of the parking lot to pick up their children. Please do not ask your child to meet you elsewhere in the parking lot. The area by the lunch tables/dumpsters is the **only** designated pick up spot on campus after school.

Because we share this pick up and drop off area with the district busses it is important to remember that the busses have priority at all times in the parking lot. Cars are not allowed to block the bus lane.

## Entering and Leaving the Playground

When children are dismissed from school they are to go directly home or to the ASES program on campus. There is no supervision for children who remain on campus. In an emergency, If a parent is detained from picking up a child on time, the parent must notify the school and the child may remain in front of the office.

## Dress Code and Grooming

### DRESS CODE

In order to provide ALL students a safe, appropriate academic environment, the District requires the following student dress:

#### **District Dress Code Standards:**

The following should **NOT** be worn at school:

Hats or caps of any kind except for sun protection purposes (inappropriate hat apparel is prohibited) ~ Halter tops, low tops, tank tops, bare midriff tops (all tops must completely cover midriff area at all times), cutoffs, extremely short skirts/shorts (underwear should be covered by clothing) - Clothing with unpatched holes, tears, unhemmed bottoms or slit cuffs ~ Clothing that advertises such substances as alcohol, cigarettes, drugs or utilizes double play on words, obscenities, profanity, or is suggestive in any way ~ Shoes without backs ~ Clothing that depicts illegal actions such as spray painting or use of fire-arms ~ **Hair styles or colors** which distract students from learning or present a safety hazard, such as hair that has been colored in shades which are loud and distracting (i.e., purple, green, pink, etc.) hair which has been cut to, or grown to, styles or lengths resulting in distraction or safety hazard ~ Jewelry which poses a threat to the health and safety of students or which by its size or appearance is distracting in the learning environment (i.e., jewelry with sharp edges or which is so long or dangling as to pose a safety hazard) ~ There is no visible "body piercing" allowed. We prefer boys not to wear earrings or cologne and all students K-6 not to wear make-up and artificial nails.

**Additional Dress Standards:**

The following attire is **NOT** to be worn at school:

- Insignias and logos of non-school sponsored organizations that may be associated with inappropriate activities.
- Hooded sweatshirts and jackets must be worn with hoods down.
- Belt buckles, jewelry, bandanas, stocking caps, hair nets, rags, gloves, biker wallets or other decorations with initials, “gang” related symbols or signs.
- Any pants/shorts that are oversized and inappropriate for the wearer. **All pants must fit and be worn at waist level.**
- Tattoos may not be visible.
- Any shirt with long sleeves which is dramatically oversized and inappropriate for the wearer, any oversized tee shirt, sweat shirt or polo shirt which has been modified with the addition of ironed-on creases or pleats on the front or back; net shirts.
- Any clothing directly related to “gang” and/or “drug cultures”.

Since student attire trends change, the previous lists will be updated and communicated as needed in order to ensure an appropriate and safe school setting.

Decisions regarding the appropriateness of clothing will be handled by the principal. In the event there is a concern regarding clothes or appearance, parents may call the school or the school will contact the parents.

Please check with your school principal prior to purchasing a new “trend” article that could be in conflict with their standard dress codes.

**Walnut School requests that students not have extreme hairstyles, including “Mohawks.” Additionally, shorts and pants should be worn on the waist with belts. Belt buckles should not have any initials on them.**

**Neither boys nor girls should wear perfume/cologne and girls should not wear nail polish.**

**Every Friday is spirit day: Students are encouraged to wear Walnut School shirts or red, white and blue on these days.**

## **Lunch**

Lunches or lunch money that is brought to the office will be kept there until lunch time. Your child's name, room number and teachers name should be on the container. Classrooms will NOT be disrupted to inform the student that his/her lunch or money is in the office; therefore, remind your child that he/she should check in the office if he/she is expecting you to bring a lunch, or if they do not have a lunch or lunch money.

Anything in a glass container is not allowed at school. For those who bring their lunch, milk or juice may be purchased.

Hot lunches may be purchased on the day of or prepaid by check or cash. Students are encouraged to bring their lunch money in a Ziploc bag, envelope or coin purse.

Please check the lunch menu for current prices and other information.

## **Birthdays**

Student birthdays are celebrated in a variety of ways at the discretion of the teacher. At no time is class time to be used for a party. Please do not send treats to the classroom for your child's birthday. We would respectfully ask that you not send any balloons, stuffed animals, flowers or food to the school for your child's birthday.

## **Lost and Found**

Lost and found clothing and lunch boxes will be located on racks in front of the multipurpose room. Other lost and found items will be kept in the office. Please be sure to label clothing, backpacks, and handbags with your child's first initial and full last name.

## **Student Property**

No toys are to be brought from home unless it is appropriate for that day's curriculum and the teacher has given permission. Any item brought from home is the responsibility of the child and will not be replaced at district or school expense. This includes cell phones, MP3/iPod players, and portable video games.

## **Student "Drag Bags" and Backpacks**

It is recommended by the American Chiropractic Association, the American Physical Therapy Association,

the American Academy of Orthopedic surgeons and the district administration that students utilize either a drag bag on wheels or a backpack with wide straps that is carried on both shoulders and weighs no more than 10-15% of the students weight. It is also recommended that parents frequently check students' backpacks and drag bags to ensure that only necessary materials are carried and that they are within suggested weight limits. Set up a time at least once a week to weigh your child's drag back/backpack to prevent overloading.

## Use of Cell Phones

Walnut School discourages the use of cell phones for our students because of the possibility of misuse, theft and damage. If you child does bring a cell phone to school it is with the understanding that it is for emergency use only during school hours. Otherwise it must be turned off and kept out of sight during the entire school day. Any violation of this policy will result in the confiscation of the student's phone.

## Classroom Interruptions

**In an effort to cut down on classroom interruptions and increase student learning time, we will not interrupt classrooms between 8:00 and 2:30 (1:30 on Wednesdays) unless it is an emergency.** Every time a request is made to relay a message to a student or a teacher in the classroom, office staff must call the classroom and interrupt the class. Since our primary goal is to provide a strong instructional program for our students we want to do everything possible to minimize disruptions in the classroom.

Please do not call the office to relay messages to your child unless it is an emergency. Inform your child, before they leave for school in the morning, of any plans for after school they may need to know such as the following:

- Who is picking them up after school?
- Do they need to go to childcare? Their babysitter? A neighbor's house?
- What if it rains?
- Do they have homework or special projects?
- Make sure their lunch is taken care of; be sure that they take their lunch with them to school or that they have enough lunch money for that day.

## Volunteers

We encourage volunteers to be active at our school and are very appreciative of the many services they perform for us. We do require that all volunteers and visitors sign in at the office. Identification badges are available in the office and must be worn at all times while on campus.

The PTA will send a volunteer request form at the beginning of each school year. We ask that you fill this out in order to be a volunteer.

# Code of Conduct

Most Walnut School students do very well both academically and behaviorally. Unfortunately, students now and then, by their conduct, can hinder themselves and other students from receiving the best possible educational experience. In order to correct this situation, provide motivation, and have students realize the consequences of their actions, the following Code of Conduct has been established:

## WALNUT SCHOOL'S TWO MAIN GOALS ARE:

1. To provide a positive classroom climate that promotes learning.
2. To provide a safe and caring total school environment for students and staff.

## 1.0 WALNUT SCHOOL BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

**Students are, at all times, expected to be:**

- **Respectful**
- **Responsible**
- **Safe**

These behavior expectations and how they apply to various settings on campus will be posted in each room.

## 2.0 SCHOOL STANDARDS

During the first weeks of school, students will be taught the above behavior expectations. In order for students to understand and accept the school policies and rules that regulate student behavior, each teacher will explain, review and, if appropriate, even demonstrate, or model, the expectations, consequences and rewards of the program.

A CARING STUDENTS DAY/ASSEMBLY PROGRAM OR SPECIAL DRAWING will be available to reward those students who act responsibly. (No Principal's referral or "Majors").

## 2.1 PRINCIPAL'S REFERRAL PROCEDURES

A Student Behavior file will be maintained in the Principal's office.

Students who commit any of the misbehaviors cited on the Principal's referral choose to miss the CARE DAY/ASSEMBLY activities and are choosing the following consequences:

- 2.1.1 First Principal's referral – Principal sends referral home for parents to sign. Student serves 1 day lunch detention.
- 2.1.2 Second Principal's referral - Principal sends referral home for parents to sign. Student serves 2 days lunch detention.
- 2.1.3 Third Principal's referral - Principal sends referral home for parents to sign. Student serves 5 days lunch detention. A third Principal's referral automatically constitutes a meeting with Principal and parent(s). Principal will explain procedures and counsel with student and parent(s).
- 2.1.4 Fourth Principal's referral - Principal sends home referral to be signed and student serves 1/2 hour after school for 5 days or 1 day suspension.

Continued defiance will necessitate the student being suspended for the remainder of the day and possibly the next full day. Parent will be called to pick up the student. Before the student returns to class, a conference will be requested with the student, parent, teacher and principal. California Education Code Section 48903 mandates that the parent/guardian shall respond without delay to the request from school officials to attend a conference regarding student behavior.

**THE USE OF A DANGEROUS INSTRUMENT TO THREATEN OTHERS OR THE POSSESSION OR USE OF ANY ILLEGAL DRUGS WILL BE CAUSE FOR IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION AND POSSIBLE EXPULSION.**

## **Additional Behavior Expectations**

In order to honor our commitment to provide a safe learning environment for all students, the following actions are prohibited:

### **1. Possession of Weapons, Replicas, or Toy Weapons.**

Any student found with a weapon or a replica while on school grounds or while attending an authorized school activity will be suspended pending a discipline/expulsion panel. The decision of this panel could include expulsion from the La Habra City School District.

### **2. Sexual harassment of anyone at school or a school related activity.**

Any student who engages in sexual harassment of anyone at school or a school related activity will be subject to discipline action which could include suspension and/or expulsion.

## Emergency Cards and Procedures

In September of each year, every child will bring home an emergency card to be completed and returned to school immediately. These forms are kept confidential. Please remember to include phone numbers where you can be reached including work number and cell phone number if applicable. If you plan to be away for the day, please inform your child how to reach you in an emergency. **Please remember to update your emergency card in case of a change of address, babysitter or employment.**

## Fire Drills

The school conducts fire and emergency drills routinely. The fire department also conducts annual safety inspections.

## Earthquake

If a major earthquake occurs, students will remain at school. Parents may pick up their child when they are able to do so. The student pickup area will be near room 1 at the end of our north parking lot. We ask that, in the event of an emergency, you follow all staff instructions for picking up your child.

Food and water are stored at the school as a precaution, in case of a major earthquake or catastrophe.

## Medication

**If your child is required to take medication during school hours, please obtain a medication form from the school office. Have your child's physician complete the form and return it to the office. No medicine may be given without this completed form.**

## Teleparent Notification System

Walnut School will be utilizing a parental notification and involvement program called **Teleparent**. The school will use this system to notify you of important meetings, events or updates in case of emergency.

We will be using your **home telephone number** as listed on our student records to make these contacts. *If you want a different number to be used (cell phone, work phone, updated home phone number) or a different language used, please indicate on page 14 of this handbook.*
